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Definitions

Adult ICU – beds that can support critically ill/injured patients including ventilator support

Medical/Surgical – also thought of as “Ward” beds.

Burn – thought of as Burn ICU beds, either approved by the American Burn Association or self-designated. (These beds are NOT to be included in other ICU bed counts)

Pediatric ICU – as for Adult ICU, but for patients 17 years and younger.

Pediatrics – “Ward Medical/Surgical” beds for patients 17 and younger.

Psychiatric – “ward” beds on a closed/locked psychiatric unit or ward beds where a patient will be attended by a sitter.

Negative Pressure/Isolation – beds provided with negative airflow, providing respiratory isolation. NOTE: This value may represent available beds included in the counts of other types.

Operating Rooms – an operating room that is equipped and staffed and could be made available for patient care in a short period of time.

24 Hour Beds Available – this value represents an informed estimate as to how many vacant (staffed, unoccupied) beds for each bed type above the current number that could be made available within 24 hours. This would include created institutional surge beds as well as beds made available by discharging/transferring patients.

72 Hour Beds Available – This value represents an informed estimate as to how many vacant (staffed, unoccupied) beds for each bed type above the current number that could be made available with 72 hours. This would include created institutional surge beds as well as beds made available by discharging/transferring patients.

Mass Decontamination Status – the number of mass decontamination equipment and supplies that the facility can deploy without calling fire department HAZMAT teams.

Ventilators – the numbers of ventilators that are present in the institution but are currently not in use and could be supported by currently available staff.

Disaster Trailer – the number of disaster trailers that can be deployed when (1) surge one is activated and (2) after 24 hours of surge one activation.
