Any business that uses, handles, or stores hazardous materials, regulated substances, or hazardous wastes, above threshold quantities, that fails to submit a hazardous materials business plan into CERS within 30 days of starting business will be determined to be in violation of California Health and Safety Code Section 25503.5 and 25510 and may be subject to administrative or civil penalties of up to \$2,000.00 for each day the violation exists. **If you have any questions regarding how this applies to your business, call the Environmental Health Services Division, Hazardous Materials Management Program at (661) 862-8740.**

Hazardous Material - any material that, because of its quantity, concentration, or physical or chemical characteristics, pose a significant present or potential hazard to human health and safety or the environment. **Common hazardous materials include (but are not limited to) the following: gasoline, diesel, lubricating oils, waste oil, compressed gases, liquefied gases such as propane, chlorine, anhydrous ammonia, acids, caustics, pesticides, paint, radioactive isotopes, and explosives.**

Regulated Substance - These materials are Extremely Hazardous Substances or Acutely Hazardous Materials and are listed in Table 1 and Table 2 of the Federal Regulated Substances List and Threshold Quantities for Accidental Release Prevention, or Table 3, State Regulated Substances List and Threshold Quantities for Accidental Release Prevention. **Examples of “regulated substances” may include the following: anhydrous ammonia, chlorine, sulfur dioxide, propane, pesticides/herbicides.**
