The State Consolidated Debris Removal Program provides comprehensive debris removal, hazard tree removal, and environmental cleanup services to property owners at no out-of-pocket cost. To enroll in the program, property owners must submit a **Right-of-Entry Permit** to Kern County Public Health.

Program Eligibility & Enrollment

Only structures 120 square feet or larger are eligible for debris removal. Property owners who do any clean-up outside of this program will be ineligible to participate in the program.

OPERATIONS OVERVIEW



Debris Removal

All fire-impacted metal, ash, debris, concrete, including foundations, and contaminated soil are removed.



Soil Analysis

Remaining soil is compared to cleanup goals and confirmed to be safe.



Hazard Tree Removal

All trees determined to pose a hazard to public roads or infrastructure will be removed.



Erosion Control

Hydromulch, wattles, and/or wood chips are installed to prevent erosion.

Program Costs

If property owners have insurance proceeds allocated for debris removal, these proceeds must be remitted back to the government. All other costs are paid by the government.
