WHY: It is estimated that 30% of first responders will suffer from PTSD as compared

with 20% in the general population. A recent study shows that paramedics, EMT's, and firefighters were reported to have higher suicide ideation and suicide attempt rates than the rest of society. In law enforcement, the estimates suggest

between 125 and 300 police officers commit suicide every year.
